



#### January - Georg Christian Lichtenberg

Georg Christian Lichtenberg (physicist, philosopher und litterateur 1742-1799): Monument (1992) by Prof. Dr. Volker Neuhoff in the courtyard of the academy (Papendiek) of the State and University Library of Lower Saxony.



#### February - New physics

New physics building (formally opened on 13/10/2005) in the northern area of the university, Friedrich-Hund-Platz.



#### March - Victoria Water

Victoria Water Lily in the Victoria House of the "Old Botanical Garden". Founded as "hortus medicus" in 1736 it was created on both sides of the town wall. Since 1974 the historic greenhouses are being renovated. An end to these works is not yet in sight.

#### **April - Monument**

Monument in front of the Auditorium Maximum (Weender Straße) in remembrance of the members of the Georgia – Augusta deceased between 1914-1918 and 1939-1945.



#### May - The German Theatre

The German Theatre built in 1888/89 by court builder Gerhard Schnittger in the new baroque style modelled on the ducal court theatre in Oldenburg.

## July - Rohns' sche bathhouse

Rohns' sche bathhouse in Cheltenham Park (reconstructed in 1972/73, built by Christian Friedrich Andreas Rohns in 1819/20 as the first public bathhouse; figural frieze featuring Asklepios [Greek god of medicine] and his daughter Hygeia, [goddess of health and patron of pharmacists)

Playground: Children's Climbing Forest, Schillerwiese 2002




## September - SUB

New building of the State and University Library of Lower-Saxony (SUB) on the main campus ("Platz der Göttinger Sieben"). The library was awarded "Library of the Year 2002" and is one of the five biggest libraries in Germany.





**Oktober - Promenade around the historic city centre**Promenade around the historic city centre (Remains of the city wall built between 1362 and 1577) with a view of St. Albani Church.



November - Synagogue Memorial Synagogue Memorial (sculpture made from bronze and steel by Corrado Cagli) in remembrance of the victims of the holocaust in the location of the synagogue burned down in 1938.



### **December - Goose Girl**

The town's landmark; the market well (1901) featuring the "Gänseliesel" (Goose Girl) the "most often kissed girl in the world", for traditionally everyone newly awarded a doctorate at the University of Göttingen has to kiss her.
